DATA GOVERNANCE IN AFRICA INITIATIVE Call for Proposals: Non-Profit & Public Sector

The **Data Governance in Africa Initiative** is a project financed by the European Union that aims to support a "development-oriented and human-centric data economy and society in Africa". The Initiative is part of a broader strategic partnership between the **African Union** and **European Union** regarding Digital Cooperation and is seen as a key component of the Joint AU-EU Vision for sustained and sustainable economic growth.

The Call for Proposals outlined in this document falls under this Initiative and is part of a larger collaboration between **Enabel, HAUS and ESTDEV**, respectively the Belgian, Finnish and Estonian development agencies. HAUS and ESTDEV are launching a separate, complementary Call targeting a different set of stakeholders in Africa's digital & data ecosys-

Wehubit (Enabel's Innovation Hub) focuses on governmental institutions and other "not-for-profit" actors such as academia, Civil Society Organisations, Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) and Social Enterprises. **ESTDEV** and **HAUS** will be supporting **private sector** actors through a partnership/ investment brokering facility and capacity building on Investment Readiness. The **objective** of the Call for Proposals under Wehubit is to identify and support the scaling of data-driven Digital Social Innovations (DSIs) in Africa implemented by public institutions, academia, Civil Society Organisations (CSOs), Non-Governmental Organisations (NGOs) and/or Social Enterprises through a **grant facility** and **capacity building** activities. By combining financial support (i.e. grants) and capacity building, the targeted entities are enabled to scale existing, early-stage data-driven DSIs.

What the Call for Proposals will offer ?

Wehubit seeks to strengthen the **involvement** of national and/or regional digital and data ecosystems in concretising and implementing **data-driven solutions** to societal challenges, such as bridging gender, rural/urban, connectivity, and other disparities.

The rationale of this Call is to ensure that a variety of stakeholders are involved in addressing these challenges by **increasing/facilitating/stimulating** (cross-border) **data usage** and **sharing**. it also aims to facilitate the collaboration between **government** and **citizens/CSO**s.

Ultimately, this Call's goal is to empower not-for-profit and public stakeholders in using data to improve the quality of **decision-making** and **policy-making**.

Geographic scope

Benin, Botswana, Burundi, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, Ghana, Guinea, Kenya, Mauritania, Mozambique, Namibia, Nigeria, Rwanda, Uganda, Senegal, Somalia, South Africa, Tanzania, Ivory Coast and Zambia.

Thematic scope

Overall, the data-driven DSIs should contribute to closing existing **digital divides/ gaps** (e.g. urban/rural, gender, youth, etc.). The DSIs should furthermore address one of the following priority themes:

E-Health/epidemics

Digital inclusion (e.g. youth & gender gaps, digital rights, digital skills/education, decent work, social protection)

- Climate change (e.g. just energy transition, natural resource management, waste management, and climate-smart, sustainable agriculture)
- Governance (e.g. e-governance, social cohesion/peace-security, resource mobilisation, smart cities, transportation, taxes/customs)
